बिपिन चन्द्र पाल



बिपिन चन्द्र पाल भारत में राष्ट्रवादी आन्दोलन के अग्रणी नेताओं में से थे। वह "लाल-बाल-पाल" के रूप में प्रसिद्ध तीन महान् स्वतंत्रता सेनानियों की त्रिमूर्ति में से एक थे और 'स्वराज' या पूर्ण राजनैतिक स्वतंत्रता के विचार पर मजबूती के साथ कायम रहे, जिसे केवल साहस, स्व-सहायता और आत्मोत्सर्ग के माध्यम से ही प्राप्त किया जा सकता था। अपने काल में बहुमुखी व्यक्तित्व के धनी श्री बिपिन चन्द्र पाल का घटनापूर्ण जीवन शिक्षक, पत्रकार, लेखक, वक्ता, पुस्तकालयाध्यक्ष तथा सामाजिक और राजनैतिक कार्यकर्ता के रूप में उनके योगदान में झलकता है। बंगाल में पुनर्जागरण के पुरोधा श्री पाल ने जनता के मन में बैठी सामाजिक हठधर्मिता और रूढ़िवादिता का विरोध और आलोचना करने की प्रवृत्ति को प्रोत्साहित किया। प्रारम्भ में वे ब्रह्म समाज के सदस्य बने, उसके बाद वेदांत-दर्शन की ओर मुड़े और अन्त में श्री चैतन्य महाप्रभु के वैष्णव-दर्शन के समर्थक बने।



विदेशी वस्तुओं के बहिष्कार की अपील

बिपिन चन्द्र पाल (Bipin Chandra Pal) ने लाला लाजपत राय और बाल गंगाधर तिलक के साथ मिलकर देशवासियों से विदेशी वस्तुओं के बहिष्कार की अपील की और स्वदेशी वस्तुओं को बढ़ावा दिया। उन्होंने पूर्ण स्वराज के लिए राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा पर भी जोर दिया। इसके लिए उन्होंने कई जनसभाएं भी कीं।

उनका मानना था कि भारत में विदेशी वस्तुओं के उपयोग के कारण अर्थव्यवस्था पर काफी बुरा असर पड़ रहा है और देश में बेरोजगारी की समस्या बढ़ रही है। पाल मानते थे कि आजादी, अहिंसावादी आंदोलनों से नहीं पाई जा सकती। इसके बावजूद, उन्होंने 1905 में बंग-भंग आंदोलन के दौरान सुरेन्द्रनाथ बनर्जी और कृष्ण कुमार मिश्र जैसे नरमपंथी नेताओं का भरपूर सहयोग किया और वायसराय लॉर्ड कर्जन के विभाजनकारी नीतियों के खिलाफ





Bipin Chandra Pal was a prominent leader of Indian nationalist movement. He was a social reformer also. He joined Brahma Samaj and led protests against social evils. He was advocate of widow remarriage. After the death of his first wife he married a widow. He supported Age of Consent Bill 1891 which increased marriageable age for girls from 10 to 12 years. He was against untouchability. He started weekly Paridarshak. In his book Economic Menace of India, he demanded increase in wages and reducing work hours for workers. He was one of the Bal-Pal-Lal trio.
