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Measurement of Length

Class: III A&B

Subject: Mathematics

Through the activity of planting seeds and regularly measuring the height of the plant, Class III students gained a clear and practical understanding of measurement of length. Communication Models & Role-Play

Class: I

Subject: EVS

Children brought different types of communication models from home, such as telephone, mobile phone, letterbox, TV, radio and newspaper. In the class, each child showed their model and explained what it is used for. After that, they performed a short role-play to demonstrate how the communication works.

For example, some children acted like sending and receiving letters, some pretended to make a phone call, and others showed how messages are shared through TV or radio.

The activity helped children understand the difference between old and modern means of communication while building their public speaking confidence.



Means of Communication

Class : II-B

Subject : EVS

The children made a chart showing how communication systems have changed from olden days to the present. They learned that in the past people used postcards, letters, messengers, pigeons, and telegrams to share messages, which took a long time to reach. Later, communication became easier with landline telephones, radios, newspapers, and television. Finally, they understood how modern communication has become very fast through mobile phones, email, internet, and social media. Through this activity, the children clearly understood the difference between slow communication of olden days and instant communication used today, and they also learned how technology has improved the way we connect with others.



Watercycle

Class : III

Subject : EVS

In this activity they understand the stages of the watercycle: evaporation, condensation, precipitation, and collection. They observed how water changes its form in nature. They observed physical changes in water through hands-on experience. They can explain how the water cycle maintains the availability of water on Earth.

Class: V

Subject: Social science
